#### November Spotlight on a Sensational Senior Servant of Morris Street Baptist Church By Deacon Al Sumter



#### Brother Irving S. Robinson

Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye steadfast, unmovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labor is not in vain in the Lord. -1 Corinthians 15:58

Dedicated. Committed. Humble. Three words that encapsulate the excellence in Brother Robinson's steadfast and unmovable commitment to serving the Lord.

Brother Robinson (affectionately called Brother Irv) fondly remembers coming to Morris Street Baptist as a young child in his mother's arms. His mother's godly example and sacrifice became the catalyst for him to embark upon a lifetime of Christian service.

Upon graduating from South Carolina State College with a degree in Social Studies in 1959, his goal was to pursue a career as an educator in the public schools. However, he was commissioned as Second Lieutenant in the United States Army in the same year where he sacrificially served our country for five years.

As a serviceman headquartered at Fort Leonard Wood in Missouri, he met his lovely wife the late Juanita Bennerman Robinson and the two were married in 1962. The Robinsons traveled the world extensively. After being stationed in Germany (where their son Erich was born), Brother Robinson and his family moved to Philadelphia, Pennsylvania (where their son Micah was born) and served as the Vice President of Estates and Trusts with the First Pennsylvania Bank. Upon returning to Charleston, South Carolina, Brother Robinson served as Personnel Director at Davol/C. R. Bard Company in Moncks Corner, South Carolina until his retirement in 1999.

As a dedicated member of Morris Street Baptist Church, Brother Robinson graced us with his anointed gift of song as a skillful tenor and cheerfully served as the Director of the Hour of Power Choir, a member of the Senior Choir, a member of the Mass Choir, and formulated the Crusaders, a gospel quartet, which consisted of the late Deacon Isaac Godfrey, the late James P. Diggs, and the late Raymond Robinson, who was Brother Robinson's brother. The Crusaders shared the gospel of Jesus Christ through many songs at Morris Street Baptist Church on special occasions and around the low country as they were the guests at numerous churches in the Charleston area.

Brother Robinson's desire to become a teacher became a reality when he accepted the call to share the gospel based on his exceptional biblical knowledge and application of God's word. He served as a dedicated instructor at weekly Bible studies for decades under the leadership of the late Pastor A. R. Blake. Many of us recall Brother Robinson's commitment to sharing the love and word of God as our beloved Sunday School Teacher of Adult Class #4.

Additionally, Brother Robinson served as Chairman of the Trustee's Ministry for 25 years.

Brother Robinson is also a member of the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity. He and his wife have been the successful owners of a catering business for over 31 years.

As a fun fact, did you know that this octogenarian has a penchant for crossword puzzles?

He and his late wife have two sons: Deacon Erich Robinson of Charleston, SC and Micah Robinson, a daughter-in-law, Erika, and two handsome and smart grandsons, Harrison Irvin (15) and Austin Ellis (11) of Lilburn, Georgia.

#### Highlight –Sensational Senior Member of Morris Street Baptist Church

Sister Geneva B. Robinson hails from the close-knit community of Elko, SC in Barnwell County. She received her bachelor's degree from South Carolina State College in 1956 with a major in Physical Education and a minor in Biology. Sister Robinson earned a master's degree in Biology from Indiana University in Bloomington, Indiana.

Sister Robinson taught physical education and Biology for six years in Spartanburg County School District and also served as a Coach for the girls' volleyball, basketball and softball teams. In addition, she taught the same subjects in the Charleston County School District for 22 years where she retired from serving the students at Burke High School in downtown Charleston, SC.

In 1967 Sister Robinson joined Morris Street Baptist Church by letter from the Saint Peters Baptist Church of Elko, SC. Eager to share her love of Christ and genuine interest in helping children, Sister Robinson began a meaningful Christian fellowship by becoming a dedicated member of Sunday School, the Hour of Power Choir and eventually the Senior Choir. She served in the Missionary Society and accepted a leadership role as president for 6 years. Under Sister Robinson's leadership, she spearheaded the outreach efforts of the Missionaries in securing and distributing countless Thanksgiving and Christmas baskets annually over the years, in addition to helping church members and other community persons in need. As the consummate educator, Sister Robinson subsequently became a Sunday School Teacher of Adult Class #7. She continued to share her love of children and adults of all ages and expertise as an educator by accepting the position of Director of the Vacation Bible School for numerous years.

If you ask Sister Robinson if she has a favorite scripture, she will say Psalms 27, which begins as

1 The LORD is my light and my salvation—whom shall I fear? The LORD is the stronghold of my life—of whom shall I be afraid? And concludes with <sup>13</sup> I remain confident of this: I will see the goodness of the LORD in the land of the living. <sup>14</sup> Wait for the LORD; be strong and take heart and wait for the LORD.

Sister Robinson, an elegant octogenarian, enjoys bowling with the Shriner's league, sewing in general and gardening and tending to her tomatoes, peppers and banana trees. She and her late husband Robert have been married for 53 years and are pet parents to a dog (Faith) who is affectionately known as king of the house.
