Founded as Dart Hall in 1927 by his daughter, Susan Dart Butler, the library originated as a reading room to provide library services to African Americans in Charleston. She operated the reading room until the opening of the Dart Hall Branch of the Charleston Free Library in 1931, making it the first library for African Americans in the state of South Carolina.

Sister Eunice G. Waddy was born in Charleston, SC to the late Edward G. Gibson and Jennie L. Gibson. She was educated in the public schools and is a graduate of Burke High School, South Carolina State University, and Columbia University. Sister Waddy taught in the schools of Charleston for 40 plus years.

She joined Morris Street Baptist Church at an early age and was baptized by the late Rev. Jacob C. Dunbar. Sister Waddy was a member of the Missionary Ministry, Hour of Power Choir, Vacation Bible School, a Sunday School Teacher, and was one of the first females to be elected to the Board of Trustees. She was also honored as Trustee Emeritus in October 2014 for her many years of dedicated work on the Board of Trustees.

She was married to the late Gonzales S. Waddy and to this union two sons were born: Gregory Steven Waddy and Kent Gibson Waddy. Her favorite Bible verses are Proverbs 3:5-6, and Isaiah 40:28-31.
